

Mid-Atlantic Charity Horse Show Rules & Regulations

STALLS: Stalls are permanent 10X10, with doors. Doors MAY NOT be removed. Exhibitors will be responsible for damage to the stalls. Stall fee is \$125 (first bedding **NOT** included). Stall fees are not refundable after the closing date. Horses without a stall will be assessed a \$50 grounds fee, per day. Any damage to stalls must be reported to the show management upon your arrival, failure to do so will constitute liability for any fees charged by the Dream Park. **Even if you are bringing only 1-2 horse(s) we recommend you rent a tack stall for safety and security reasons. If you hang, tie to or use any open stall the Dream Park may count that as your stall and you will be responsible.**

ARRIVAL TIMES: Stalls will be available after 12 noon July 17, 2019 and must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day after the show, July 22, 2019. Prior arrangements for early arrivals and late departures **MUST** be made in advance of the show and will be assessed a \$25 per day charge. Arrangements may be made by contacting the Show Secretary.

SCHOOLING: Upon arrival times on the 17th the show ring will be open for schooling, however, be aware that preparations of the ring (such as the setup of center ring) can be taking place which will be announced. Trainers and exhibitors are welcome to utilize the show ring for schooling during this set up period if needed. Once the show commences, availability will be announced and the ring will close 30 minutes before the start of each session. The show ring is 150' x 300' with composite soil footing. Warm up rings will be available for exhibitor's use. The outdoor warm up ring has stone dust footing and the indoor has composite soil footing.

PAYMENTS: A penalty of \$75 will be charged for all returned checks. Cash or certified check must replace returned checks. No one will be allowed to show if they have a check or handling fee outstanding. **All fees must be paid before numbers will be released or an open check must be on file.**

ENTRIES: Entries close on Monday July 8, 2019. Post-entries will be accepted. Entry fees are as follows: Qualifiers \$25; Championship Classes \$40, Entry blanks must be completed in full, signed and accompanied by full payment, registration documentation and applicable membership cards. Open checks will be accepted but no numbers will be handed out without an open check in the office. No entry will be processed without the aforementioned being complete. A non-refundable \$25 per horse office charge will be assessed. All accounts must be settled in the horse show office by the conclusion of the show. No Exceptions.

REFUNDS: All scratches must be in writing. **Before the closing date:** Horses scratched will receive a full refund of all entry and stall fees. After the closing date; all entry fees will be refunded, less a \$25 office charge, for any total scratch, which is received at least 24 hours prior to its first class. Total scratches received less than 24 hours in advance of first class must be countersigned by the Horse Show Veterinarian to qualify for any refund. **Stall fees are not refundable after the closing date of entries.**

CHANGES & SCRATCHES: The horse show office will be open one hour prior to show time each session. All changes, additions or scratches must be completed prior to the start of the session. Entry fees from timely scratched classes may be credited toward another class entered. No refund will be given.

DOGS/ANIMALS: Dogs and other animals will not be permitted on the premises unless retained on a leash and under control at all times. Unleashed animals will be subject to capture and/or fine and removal from show grounds by Logan Township or the Gloucester County Animal Shelter. A \$50 fine may be imposed on the owner of an unleashed animal. No animals, even when leashed and owned by Management personnel, are allowed in the office building, pavilion, or vendor area unless owned by the disabled. Keep dogs outside and in the barn areas.

SMOKING: There is no smoking in offices, stable pavilions, spectator pavilion, equine building or indoor arena. **As per NJ law this includes electronic cigarettes.**

FIRES: In accordance with State regulations, no open fires are ever permitted on any part of Dream Park property. Barbeque grills may be used in the camper area only. **THIS RULE IS STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

MINORS WHO DO NOT HAVE A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions.

Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s) or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parents(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DREAM PARK DOES NOT ALLOW: roller skates, skate boards, or roller blades. Bicycles, mopeds, ATV's, scooters and golf carts may not be operated around the show office, pavilion, vendor area, stall aisles or paddock area except by disabled persons, DREAM PARK employees or show officials.

DO NOT staple or post anything on stalls, fence rails or posts, buildings, stall panels, show office, trees, etc. All items are to be posted on the notice board near the show office.

STABLE PARKING AREA: Parking around the stable barns and the back side of the main building is strictly prohibited. All vehicles must be parked in the RV area or in the large main parking lot in front of the Dream Park. Be aware that in front of the main doors on the front side of the building there is a restricted parking area and the local police will ticket your car. Make sure you park in an area between the painted lines.

OFFICE HOURS:

Thursday: 10:00am - 7:00pm

Friday: 8:00 am to end of last class **Saturday:** 8:00 am to end of the last class

Sunday: 8:00am to 1 hour after the end of last class

All breaks and closings will be posted and announced. All accounts must be settled by the end of the last session.

ORDERING FEED & BEDDING: All feed and bedding must be preordered by Monday July 8, 2019, by contacting Joanne Bartley, Show Secretary. Cost of the shavings is \$8 per bale. Hay will be \$10 per bale.

CHANGE OR CANCELLATION: Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes. Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show.

RING PROCEDURE: Two minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring for the class to commence. At the end of two minutes, the gate will be closed and the class will proceed.

NOISEMAKERS: Attention getting devices and/or noisemakers, such as tape measures, blow horns, bamboo poles, explosives and fire extinguishers are not allowed in and around the warm-up and competition rings during the scheduled competition. This includes banging whips, brushes or the like on the show rail during classes. All such items will be confiscated and offenders will be reported.

SHARPS: Management requires that exhibitors comply with USEF Rule GR 1210 regarding Sharps. Failure to do so will result in a fine.

LIMIT HORSE OR RIDER CLASSES: Either the horse OR rider has not won 6 blue ribbons at a regular competition in the performance division or level in which they are shown. A horse who has won 6 blue ribbons can be shown by a rider who has not won 6 blue ribbons. A rider who has won 6 blue ribbons can show a horse who has not won 6 blue ribbons.

CAMPERS: Limited camper spaces are available at a cost of \$50 per day. Space includes water and one 50 Amp hookup. Please show number of days and costs on your entry blank. Tents or camping in tents is not permitted on DREAM PARK grounds. **2019 WILL REQUIRE A CAMPER PASS FROM THE OFFICE CONFIRMING THE NUMBER OF NIGHTS. FAILURE TO GET ONE WILL MEAN YOU WILL BE CHARGED FOR 4 NIGHTS or \$200.**

TROPHIES: All Challenge trophies are under the control of Chapter 15 and will remain in the Chapter's or the Sponsor's possession.

THE UPHA CHAPTER 15, THE MID-ATLANTIC CHARITY HORSE SHOW, ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR OFFICIAL VOLUNTEERS SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE THAT MAY OCCUR TO ANY EXHIBITOR, AGENT, TRAINER, OWNER, MANAGER, RIDER, DRIVER, HANDLER OR SPECTATOR. IT SHALL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT THE ABOVE NAME PARTIES SHALL HOLD BLAMELESS THE UPHA CHAPTER 15, THE MID-ATLANTIC CHARITY HORSE SHOW, ITS OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OR OFFICIAL VOLUNTEERS FOR ANY LOSS OF DAMAGE TO HIS/HER PERSON, EQUIPMENT, ET AL. THAT MAY OCCUR FROM SICKNESS, THEFT, FIRE OR OTHER PERIL.

COGGINS TEST/HEALTH CERTIFICATE: All horses stabled outside of NJ must have a current negative Coggins Test dated within one (1) year of the show dates and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated within 30 days of the event. All horses stabled within NJ must have a current negative Coggins test dated within two (2) years of the show dates. To speed processing, please send a copy with your entries.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: All horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus Rhinopneumontis vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of the vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody & control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures take twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, or Delegate when requested.

UPHA Exceptional Challenge Cup

Open to all English Equitation walk/trot riders Ten (10) years of age and over with a mental or physical handicap riding a mare or gelding of any breed. Rider may never have been judged at a recognized or non-recognized show at a canter. Tournament and academy classes are included as non-recognized shows. All contestants must work as a group (or in groups) of twelve (12) or less on the rail and complete an individual workout. All riders must compete at the walk and trot both ways of the ring and line-up. Riders will remain in the line-up inside the ring throughout the individual workout portion of the class. The individual workout will be "Trot down the rail to the ¾ point. Continue trotting a two-loop serpentine. Continue trotting back to the line-up." Correct diagonals shall be taken into consideration on the rail and in the individual pattern. The judging specification shall be based 60% on rail work and 40% on the individual workout. Riders may wear any standard of English dress that is appropriate for the discipline they are riding (i.e. saddle seat, hunt seat, dressage). They may also use protective and adaptive equipment necessary to them and to the division in which they show. Please see FEI adaptive equipment rules. One (1) handler per entry shall be permitted in the ring to facilitate the safety of the rider. Handlers shall stand quietly as a group in a designated area of the ring unless their assistance is requested by the judge or ringmaster.



Academy Division

Eligibility: Academy classes are limited to riders who have never shown in other than Tournament, Academy or Lead Line. Academy riders may not enter any other class at this show. Horses in Academy classes must be regularly used in a lesson program as school horses. Any breed is eligible. Academy horses may be shown in classes other than Academy at the same show. Attire: English – Jodhpurs, breeches, boots, long sleeve shirts, and tie; vests and gloves. Derbies, riding suits and jackets are prohibited. Western – western style pants, chaps, long sleeved shirt, boots and appropriate ties; vests and chaps are optional. Western hats are prohibited. Tack: May show in show bridle, Pelham, or snaffle bridle with martingale. Martingale on curb bits are prohibited. All Junior Exhibitor riders in Academy classes must wear protective headgear that meet or exceed current ASTM standards. Protective headgear is recommended for all riders. Note: First Year Class Eligibility is open to newcomers in their first year of showing. First year riders, Western and Hunter Riders will not be asked to perform a pattern.




Academy Walk Trot Equitation Championship

Starting at the ingate, trot up the rail to your right showing 2 changes of diagonal.
Continue trotting to the center point of the turn and trot a circle to your left.
Continue trotting along the rail showing 2 changes of diagonal. Stop at the end of the rail. Return to line up.

Academy Walk Trot Canter Equitation Championship

Starting at the ingate, trot along the rail to your right to the mid-point of the turn. Stop. Canter a circle to your left. Stop. Pick up a trot and trot along the rail to the end showing one change of diagonal. Stop. Return to line up.



Patterns for Academy Pattern Classes

Walk Trot Canter Class 52

- 1. Starting at the in gate trot down the rail showing 2 changes of diagonal.
- 2. Continue to the center point of the far end of the ring and continue trotting a small circle then continue making a second but larger circle.
- 3. At the center point of the end of the ring stop.
- 4. Reverse and canter on the right lead to the end of the straight away. Halt and exit the ring at a walk.

Walk Trot Class 53

- 1. Starting at the in gate trot down the rail showing 2 changes of diagonal.
- 2. Continue to the center point of the far end of the ring and continue trotting a circle.
- 3. At the center point of the end of the ring stop.
- 4. Reverse and trot on the correct diagonal to the end of the straight away. Halt and exit the ring at a walk.
